Entries for the CayugaFest 150th Anniversary Parade, which will take place at 11 a.m., July 18th, are expected to almost double from previous years. The parade route this year is three kilometres long. Assembly begins at 10 a.m. at the J.L. Mitchener School area. This year's route travels north on Munsee Street to Echo Street where it turns left onto Ottawa Street and then veers right onto Cayuga Street and then to Joseph Street with a return to the starting point.
