A self-guided tour of Cayuga's historic sites will be available from July 12th to 19th during the Village's sesquicentennial festivities. Maps will be provided to residents and visitors identifying story board locations throughout the Village . Made possible by a donation from the Mayor's Golf Tournament funds, there will be eleven 28x36 inch boards at key locations. Another thirty 8x10 boards will identify locations that once were or now are special sites. The recommended start for the tour is the former home and office of the long-time general practitioner in Cayuga, Dr. D. Ralph Weylie and Mrs. Evelyn Weylie which is located across from the Village Green.
